#### Brothers and Sisters:

As I sit down to write this I am drawn to a story about Jesus in chapter 4 of Matthew's gospel.

Then he got into the boat and his disciples followed him. <sup>24</sup> Suddenly a furious storm came up on the lake, so that the waves swept over the boat. But Jesus was sleeping. <sup>25</sup> The disciples went and woke him, saying, "Lord, save us! We're going to drown!" He replied, "You of little faith, why are you so afraid?" Then he got up and rebuked the winds and the waves, and it was completely calm.

A popular phrase lately is "the new normal", but it seems like just when I get used to one normal there's a new "new normal". One person in the congregation told me that they felt like a ship at sea without a rudder—at the mercy of the wind and waves. That makes sense to me because I feel really tossed around by so much that's out of my control. Everything seems to be changing.

I know I have written about change before and it now occurs to me that there is no "new normal". None of what we are experiencing from global pandemic to racial upheaval is normal. Moreover, the 24 hour news cycle provides a constant diet of sensationalism and exaggeration. We are in the midst of a culture that seems to have no space to breathe as we move from one crisis to another. Don't you feel at the mercy of the wind and waves?


Matthew's Jesus asks, why are you so afraid? Is it the unpredictability of things and our loss of control that inspires fear? Or is it the fact that we don't have an accurate map for how to move through these days and we feel lost? All of these questions imply that we can have some sort of control over the world—that we can predict, control or direct things. The truth is that we never had that power and only fooled ourselves thinking we did.

This is a scary conclusion. We don't have control and never did, but that conclusion only echoes our faith. We believe God is a sovereign God, creator and controller of the wind, the waves, and everything under heaven. It is not in human ability to control, manipulate, and direct the world. We are only passengers in the boat, helper bees for God's great mission in the world. Trust that God's purpose is being worked out.

Love one another. Care and comfort one another...even the least of these. This old commandment needs to be the new normal. That is our job in the midst of the storm. God will provide a direction and bring the calm.


