

WORSHIP & MUSIC NEWS:


Due to COVID-19 and the numbers going up again, the plan is to continue to meet in the Biblical Garden as long as the weather is permitting. We will keep you posted as needed.

A tribute of fresh flowers for special people as memorials or celebration is a continuing tradition, and further acknowledges the glory of God in our worship experience at the Auburn Presbyterian Church. You can

Flowers will be delivered each week from the Sprinkling Can Florists beginning the first Sunday in September and continuing through the end of the year. You will be billed directly by the church. 
